Introduction

“Ordo Sancti Lazari” (also known as The Green Book) was both a history of the Order and an Armorial, published in 1983. It was set out by Jurisdictions and their Commanderies and Delegations within those Jurisdictions.

This work is an attempt to bring the heraldic material up to date. It follows the same basic format but, since heraldry is about (amongst other things) colour, this book illustrates one coat of arms per page. For ease of use these have been set out by alphabetical geographical location.

In the interests of simplicity only the pre- and post nominals of the Order are given. Because these are in a constant state of flux the ones shown are at the time that the Arms were included. Where the artist is known then this is also given. For example some appear as initials alongside the exemplifications but, where known, these have also been given in full. Many of the Arms of the various Jurisdictions were drawn by Mathieu Chaine (marked “MC”) and Malta provided various high-quality images.

Heraldic Badges (where known) are also shown but flags, banners and penons, etc. are usually omitted.

In some cases smaller images have been used because any attempts at enlargement of the original supplied causes a break up the picture.

While some entries have been deferred because clarification is required regarding the right to use marks of nobility or the right to use the Arms supplied, all known armigers of whatever rank - active, inactive and deceased - have been included. On the subject of Knights of Justice and Knights of Grace it would appear that some Jurisdictions have not followed Regulations and have been erroneously awarding Justice Crosses. For this reason the suffix (J) after KLJ has been largely omitted.

Since, to most people, blazon is the equivalent of a foreign language the actual descriptions of the Arms are not given.

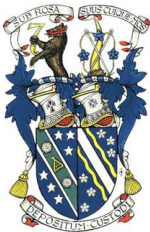

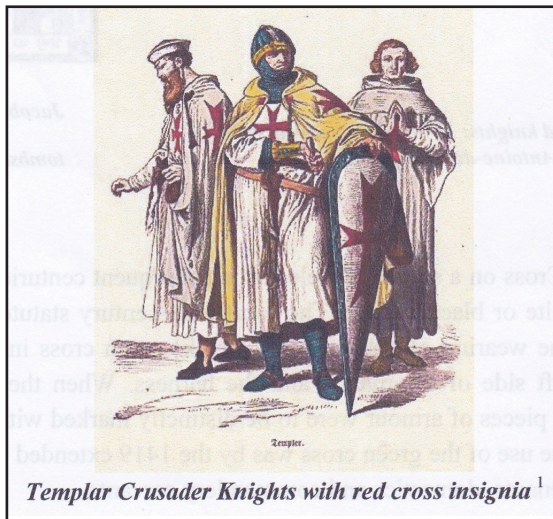

Heraldry within the Order of St. Lazarus

Introduction

Heraldry found general application in Western Europe from the second quarter of the 12th century. The heraldry in the West from the mid-twelfth to the end of the 15th century was utilitarian being used on armour in warfare, and on seals in peace. In addition, since the use of arms had been associated with the higher feudal castes, heraldry became associated in the later medieval period with the concept of gentility – an association that has persisted to the present day. Such emblems, worn on the shield and surcoat served to distinguish a man in armour, as their badges distinguished his followers. The emblems were also carried into the battlefield on standards to serve as rallying points during the conflict. The Medieval period provides numerous examples of arms borne by municipalities, churches, and colleges. Armorial bearings were also adopted in the Middle Ages by such military bodies as the Knights Templars, the Knights of St. John of Jerusalem, the Teutonic Knights, the great Spanish Orders and of course the Order of St. Lazarus.

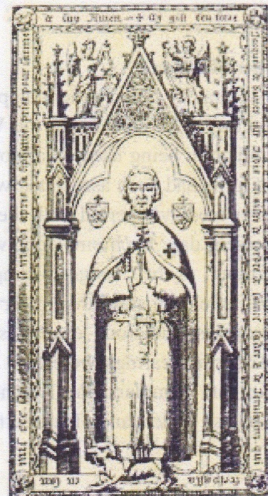


Heraldic insignia of the Order

The Order of St. Lazarus adopted the green cross while the other military orders adopted different coloured crosses – the Order of St. John adopted the white cross, the Order of the Temple adopted the red cross, while the Teutonic Order adopted the black cross. This emblem they incorporated onto their person by sewing a fabric cross onto their robe. The cross depicted was stylistically interchangeably a Latin or Greek one with variations in the design with cross branches being squarely cut off or slightly potent or patty. The heraldic coat-of-arms of the Order during the 15th century is clearly depicted on the pedestal effigy in the chapel of St Antoine-de-Grattemont in France. This is shown as a Latin green cross on a black shield. The presumably green Greek cross on the surcoat is clearly depicted on the tombstone effigy of Jacobi de Besnes (†1384) at Boigny, France.

St Antoine-de-Grattemont*

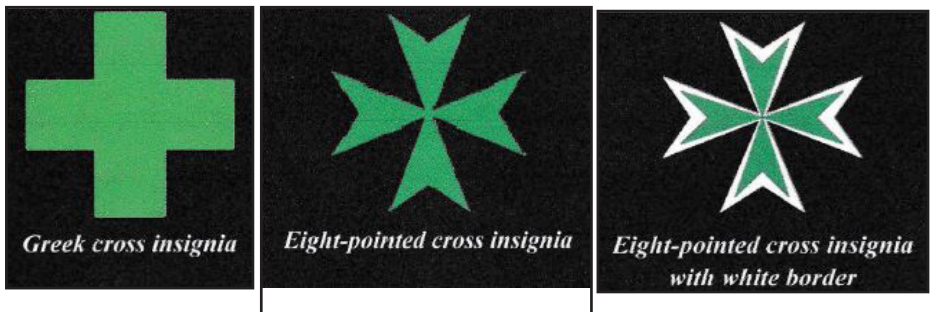

The green Greek Cross on a surcoat developed in subsequent centuries into a green Greek Cross pattée on a white or black

mantle. The fourteenth-century statutes of the Order of St Lazarus prescribed the wearing of a square [i.e. Greek] green cross insignia sewn onto the front of the habit, left side of the mantle and the harness. When they went to war, their helmet, shield and all pieces of armour were to be distinctly marked with a cross of the same shape and colour. The use of the green cross was by the 1419 extended to all the members of the Order including tenants, domestics and commandery servants.

In the mid-16th century, political developments in France required the adoption of the practice of appointing members of the Order of St John as grand masters of the Order of St Lazarus. One of these grand masters, François de Salviati in the Chapter General held in 1578 undertook to formally modify the insignia of the Order of St Lazarus. The previous Greek Cross pattern for members of the Order of St Lazarus was now modified into 'an eight-pointed cross vert'. Individuals who held joint membership in the Order of St Lazarus and of St John were to superimpose the two eight-pointed crosses resulting in 'an eight-pointed cross vert with an argent bordure'.



The eight-pointed triangular-armed cross continued to be used not only as an insignia on the mantle worn by the knights; but also, in the form of neck or breast insignia right through the subsequent centuries right through the present day.



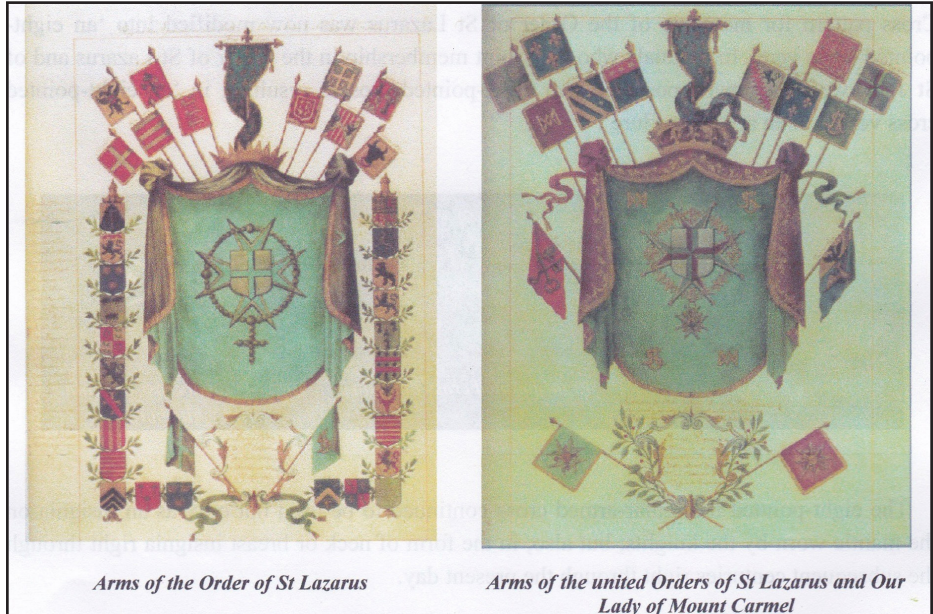
18th century insignia

Cross of the Order of St Lazarus

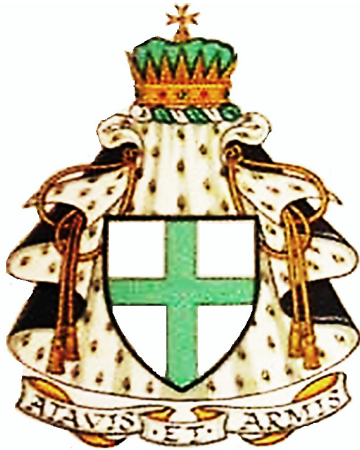
Developments during the early 17th century resulted in the amalgamation of the Order of St Lazarus with the newly established Order of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This led to a modification in the heraldry representing the combined Orders to incorporate the amethyst insignia of the junior Order. The two Orders were again separated in 1779 through a Royal Patent Letter defining the Order of St Lazarus as the more significant merit-based award.



Arms of the Order of St Lazarus

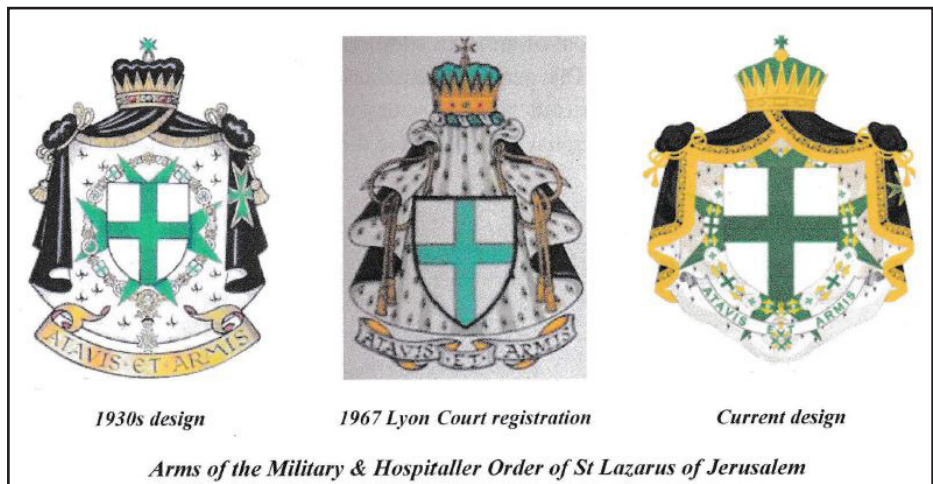
Arms of the united Orders of St Lazarus and Our Lady of Mount Carmel

The modern arms design was drawn up in the early 20th century with first depiction in 1934. A depiction of the various insignia in use at the same time was also published. A modified version was registered with the Court of The Lord Lyon in 1967.



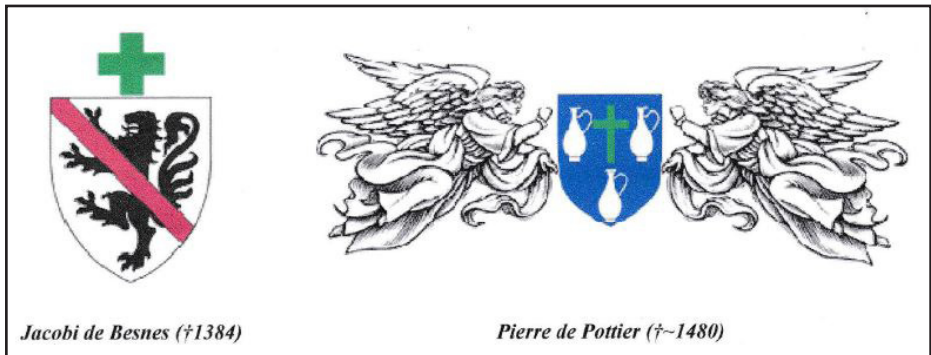

This led to the eventual adoption of the green cap after the re-unification of 2006. The internationalization of the Order, started originally in the 1930s but augmented in the 1960s, led to the formal establishment of a number of jurisdictions and sub-jurisdictions. All these have been assigned their own dedicated coat-of-arms



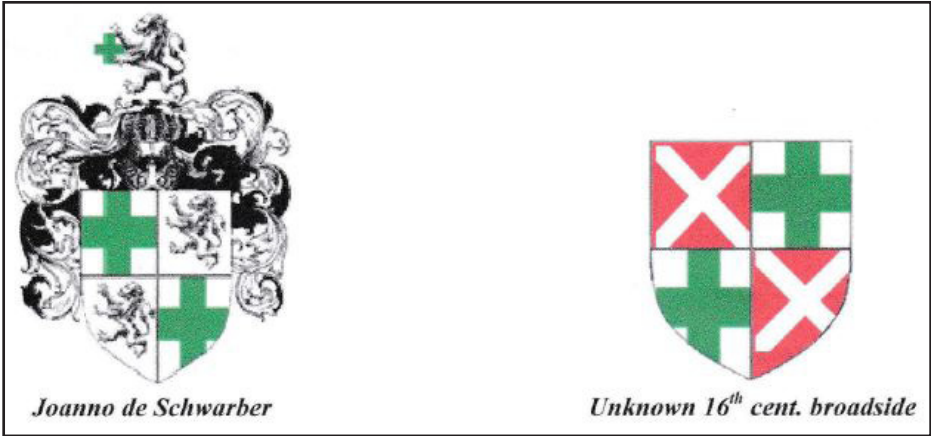
Heraldic insignia of the individual members

During the late 14th century, commanders and masters of the Order were incorporating the heraldic cross of the Order as an integral part of their personal family coat-of-arms. The earliest depiction of such personal coat-of-arms can be seen on the tomb effigy of Jacobi de Besnes (†1384) which surmounts the Greek cross, presumably green, on the de Besnes family coat of arms. Of interest, the earlier tomb effigies of Thomas de Sainville (†1312) and Jean de Paris (†1349) did not include the respective family coat-of-arms. The tombstone effigies of both de Besnes and de Paris depict a dog at the feet of individual, in heraldry signifying loyalty and leadership status in the chivalric order. The tomb effigy of Pierre de Pottier in the Chapel of the Commandery of St. Antoine de Grattemont (†~1480) directly incorporated the Latin cross of the Order as an integral part of the de Pottier family coat-of-arms. The depiction of angels or guardians of the dead as heraldic supports symbolizes spirituality.

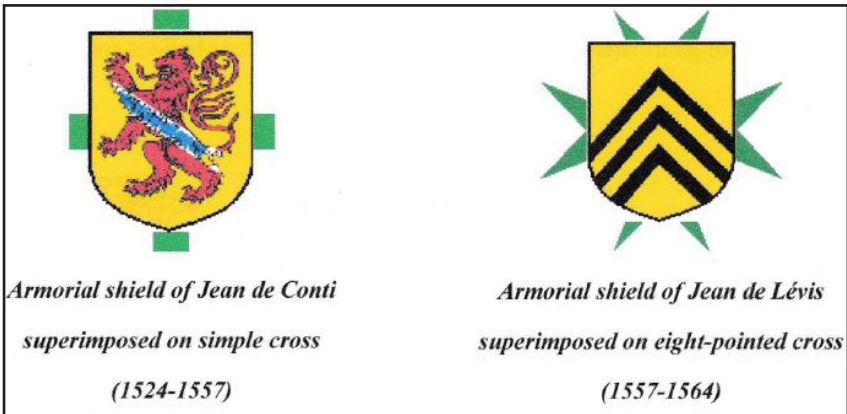


The personal coat-of-arms of the commander of Seedorf, Joanno de Schwarber (†~1443) incorporates the cross of the Order in a more complex fashion. The coat-of-arms is quartered with the Greek cross of the Order being placed in the first and fourth quarter, while the second and third depict the family coat-of-arms. In addition, a lion rampant holding the cross of the Order surmounts the crest. The personal heraldic coat-of-arms depicted in the 16th century broadside is similarly quartered with the cross of the Order being placed in the second and third quarter,

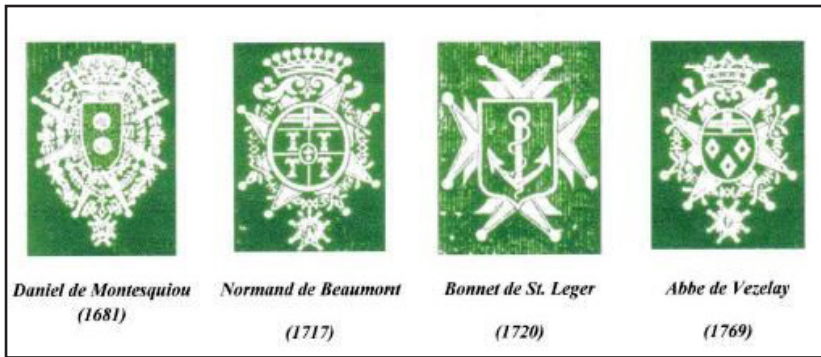
and the personal arms placed in the first and fourth quarters



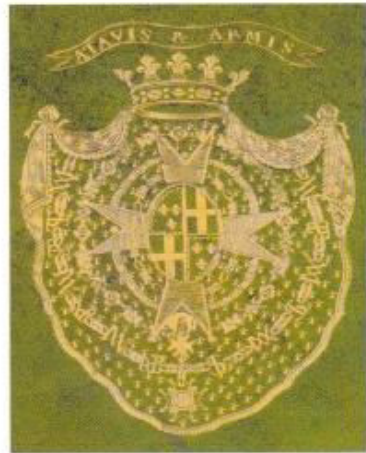
Another heraldic form of combining the personal arms with those of the Order involved the superimposition of the personal family arms onto the green cross of the Order. This is the form adopted in depicting the arms of the masters of the Order in the 18th century armorials of the Order. These arms clearly depict the development in cross form from the Greek green cross to the eight-pointed green cross which occurred during the latter part of the 16th century. Thus, the masters from the beginning up to Jean de Conti showed their coat-of-arms superimposed over a simple cross vert. This cross became an eight-pointed cross vert bordered argent after the magistracy of Jean de Lévis, i.e. after the Order started being led by individuals who were members of the Order of St Joh



Post-17th century examples of personal coat-of-arms of different masters and members of the Order of St Lazarus incised on book covers have survived.

An heraldist or héraut – roi d'armes - garde armorial was appointed by the Order to maintain and update the armorial of the Order. The post was regularly filled right through the 18th century up to the last registered council in 1830 [cf Table below]. The first surviving armorial pertaining to the Order of St Lazarus dates from the mid-18th century, this being prepared in manuscript form by Chevaliers Dorat de Chameulles and Vincent

Thomassin. The pen and ink original has fortunately survived as is presently found in the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris, France (MS Fr. 23135). A second manuscript armorial in colour was produced by the same authors and is also held in the same library (MS Fr. 31795-96). These armorials depict the various blazons belonging to the various grandmasters, knights, chaplains and serving brethren up to the end of the magistracy of the Louis d'Orléans, Duc de Chartres & Orléans in 1752.

During the organization undertaken in the 1930s, an attempt was again made to introduce the compilation of armorials relevant to the Orders with formal brevets being issued to the members under the signature of Conservateur de l'Armorial, a post held by the Superintendent General of the Order H.E. Count Charles Otzenberger-Detaille. Definite instructions relating to the use of Heraldry within the Order of St Lazarus were published in 1933.

The turmoil of the Second World War and its aftermath left the Order rather bereft of organization. The early 1960s Supreme Council does not appear to have particularly maintained the heraldic registration of the members armorial bearings. The statute governing the English Tongue promulgated in 1963 provided for the office of a Judge General of Arms and set up the Heraldic Council of the British Realms and English Tongue and South Africa. The work of the Heraldic Council was to supervise the registration of arms, the proofs of nobility, and the recording of nobiliary styles and ranks for the members within the English Tongue. The first Judge General was Sir Iain Moncreiffe of That Ilk.

The post of Herald of Arms within the Order was re-instituted in 1969 when instructions were formulated regarding the design

and use of the Order's armorial bearing in the armorial insignia of the members of the Order. The appointed Herald-Principal was Malcolm Innes of Edingight who also served as the Lyon Clerk of H.M. Lyon Court of Scotland. The regulations relating to the use of armorial bearings in personal coat-of-arms of members were reviewed in 1979. In 1982, Chev. James J. Algrant y Canete was appointed to the post of Judge of Arms. Chev. Algrant with his co-author Chev. Jean de St Vincent de Beaugourdon, set out to collate an updated armorial of the Order updating the former 18th century armorials with coat-of-arms of members admitted in the subsequent decades.

In September 1995, the Grand Magisterial Council during its meeting in Bristol confirmed, modified and approved by decision the Regulations for the recording and use of Heraldry with the Order of St Lazarus. These were formally incorporated within the statutes of the Order [GM decree 26/1995]. These established that as an international and independent Order, the Order of St Lazarus had the ability to regulate the use of heraldry within its own jurisdiction while taking in cognisance of the different prevalent world-wide legal customs. Categories of personal arms eligible for registering with the Order included:

- (a) Noble arms originating from a Sovereign or Head of a Sovereign State;
- (b) Burgher arms granted or assumed recognised by a competent recognised heraldic body; and
- (c) Assumed arms that have been in use over a period or recently adopted provided they do not infringe of the rights of others. The latter were to be relevant only within the Order.

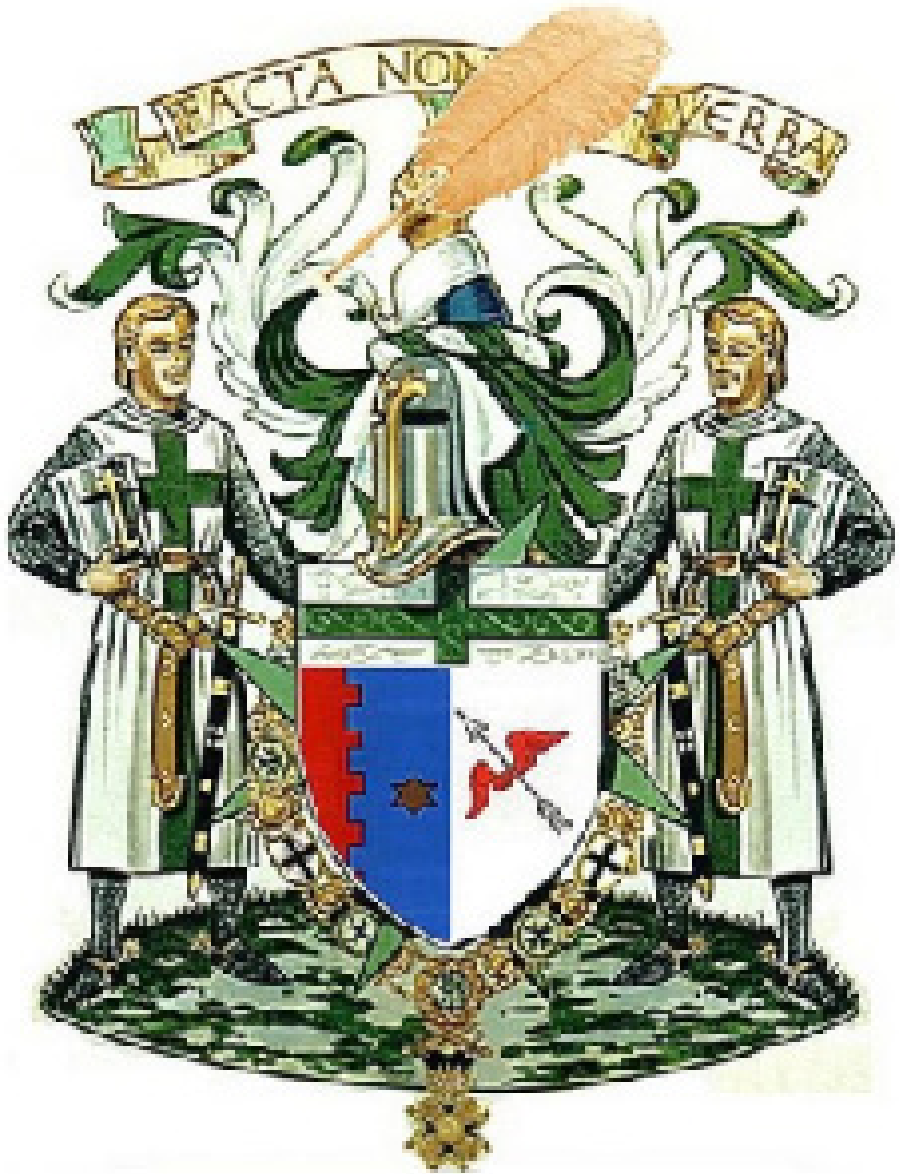
At this point the heraldic records of the Order were systematically established to include:

- the surviving ancient and updated rolls of arms reproduced in the 1983 *Ordo Sancti Lazari*;
- the Order's Golden Book comprising the arms of knights, dames or commanders who had specifically requested to be included;

- various records of arms compiled by some of the jurisdictions [e.g. Grand Priory of America] ; and
- informal record of arms of members extracted from miscellaneous publications but had not been formally registered with the Order.

By 2004, coat-of-arms belonging to various members of the Order deposited with the Grand Heraldist of the Order were being illustrated on the 2004 website of the Order.

The re-unification process bringing together the two large fractions - the Malta and Paris Obediences - necessitated a review of the statutes of the Order including the regulations pertaining to the use and registering of heraldic personal arms. These have since been modified by the decision of the Grand Magisterial Council held at Madrid in March 2012.

**Revised Regulations for the
RECORDING AND USE OF HERALDRY
Within the Order of Saint Lazarus of Jerusalem**

These Regulations are based on existing Statutes, Constitutional Decrees and Customs of the Order, as confirmed, modified and approved by decision of the Grand Magistral Council held at Bristol in September 1995, and further modified by decision of the Grand Magistral Council held at Madrid in March 2012 and the Governance Working Committee in May 2018.

The Order and Heraldic Authority

As an international and independent Canonical Order under the Spiritual Protection of the Patriarch of Antioch and All the East, of Jerusalem and of Alexandria, of the sui juris Greek Melkite Church, and governed by the Sovereign Head, the Grand Master and Grand Magistral Council according to its statutes, the Order of St. Lazarus has the ability to regulate the use of heraldry within its own jurisdiction. However, the Order has due regard for the fact that its members are citizens of many states world-wide having varying attitudes to heraldry, asserting various degrees of legal control over its use, or indeed having no official stance on the subject whatsoever. The Order also takes note of varying heraldic customs world-wide, irrespective of actual legal control or lack thereof.

Heraldry and Tradition

In the past a member of a Chivalric Order would, by the very nature of his (and more recently, her) status and way of life, have possessed armorial bearings as a matter of course. Although this is no longer the case, and no member of the Order is actually required to be or become a bearer of heraldic arms, it is desirable that the heraldic tradition should continue within the Order, both as an evocation of the Order's history and as a significant adjunct to the Order's ceremonial functions.

The Grand Officer of Arms

The Grand Officer of Arms of the Order shall be responsible for the administration of all matters concerning heraldic arms within the Order, subject to the approbation of the Grand Chancery and ultimately the Grand Master. The Grand Officer of Arms may appoint, subject to Grand Magistral approval, an assistant with the title of Vert Croix Pursuivant, subject to review every three years.

The Central Armorial Records of the Order

These shall consist of the following:

- (a) The copies of ancient rolls reproduced in the Order's Armorial and History "Ordo Sancti Lazari MCMLXXXIII".
- (b) The arms of the then-existing members who submitted them for inclusion in "Ordo Sancti Lazari MCMLXXXIII".
- (c) The Order's "Golden Book", comprising volumes of paintings of arms of those Commanders and Knights who request to be included.
- (d) Arms of their members recorded by individual Jurisdictions, and forwarded for inclusion in the Order's main record.
- (e) The current volumes of arms instituted in January 1989 and comprising facsimiles of certificates and paintings issued to members, including a legible colour copy of the original grant, matriculation or extract from the original competent heraldic granting authority, or a legible colour copy of the most recent reconfirmation of arms from such an authority.
- (f) Particulars of arms of members which have not been formally recorded with the Order, but have been extracted from various sources, and publications.

(g) The Central armorial records of the Order shall be kept at the Grand Chancery or such other seat of the Order as authorized by the Grand Chancellor.

(h) The individual Jurisdictional armorial records, where kept, shall consist of volumes of paintings or other illustrations of arms of those members and associates who wish to be included. Jurisdictions with heralds are encouraged to record arms of members and associates.

Categories of Arms Eligible for Registration

Noble Arms, being inherited, or arms newly granted, originating from a Sovereign or a Sovereign State, or by the Head of a major national or international church to the episcopate or its equivalent.

Burgher Arms - Non-noble arms which have been granted as such or have been adopted and then recorded or granted by a competent heraldic body of recognised standing.

Jurisdiction Arms - Arms which have simply been in use over a period of time, or have recently been adopted without having been formally granted or registered may be granted by the Grand Officer of Arms under the authority of the Grand Master of the Order, and the seal of the Grand Officer of Arms.

Non-noble arms must meet the following conditions –

- (a) They must conform to heraldic traditions of design.
- (b) They must not patently infringe the rights of others bearing similar arms.
- (c) They are not to be considered as noble arms.
- (d) They may be transmitted according to the laws of arms.

(e) They shall not include devices or insignia which imply noble rank or other special status, unless specific evidence is supplied of entitlement thereto.

(f) Such arms are to be for use under the Order's jurisdiction, and according to the laws of arms of jurisdictions where they are used.

Applications for Registration or Granting Arms

These shall be submitted in due form with evidence of entitlement to existing arms and any other relevant facts. The correctness of all information supplied shall be attested by the applicant and as such accepted in good faith.

Registration of arms with the Order in any particular form shall not be used in an attempt to justify the use of any unauthorised style or title or the insignia thereof.

Certificates of Registration and Grants

These will include particulars of the applicant's rank, offices, decorations and awards within the Order, and others as appropriate. Also included will be a blazon/description of the arms and particulars of their granting, or registration. The Certificate will also incorporate an illustration of the Armorial Bearings with appropriate insignia.

Heraldic Art Work

Full colour paintings, individually designed certificates and other specially commissioned art work may be provided, appropriate fees being chargeable.

Finance

Fees on a determined scale will be payable to cover the costs of

recording, issuing of certificates, provision of artwork, etc. and the general administration of the records. Costing is to be independent of any financial grants from the Order's general funds. If payment for art work is waived, the relevant amounts, with any other surplus, shall be paid to the Order's Charity Funds.

The Display of Insignia of the Order With Personal Armorial Bearings

The following optional additaments are permitted:

MLJ: The breast badge suspended on a vertical plain green riband, below the shield.

OLJ: The breast badge suspended on a vertical green riband with rosette, below the shield.

CLJ: The neck badge suspended from a green riband, partly encircling the shield.

KLJ: The Knight's neck cross with trophy, suspended from a green riband, partly encircling the shield. The shield for all knights and dames displayed upon the eight-pointed Cross of the Order which may be plain vert, or fimbriated gold, as is the cross on the Knight's mantle.

A chief of Religion (the arms of the Order, on a chief argent, a cross vert) upon the shield, above the arms for all knights and dames. (This may be omitted if a chief is already included in the arms, or for other aesthetic reasons.) Both the chief of Religion and the Maltese cross vert behind the shield are usually not borne together: only one is normally used on an achievement.

KCLJ: The arms surrounded by the KCLJ cordon (green, edged purple), with the bow and Knight's cross suspended.

GCLJ: As for KCLJ, but with the cordon and bow plain green.

Hitherto a GCLJ has been allowed to encircle the arms with the Grand Collar of the Order, but this privilege is now limited to those specifically awarded the Grand Collar.

A GCLJ may adopt supporters to the arms if such are not already borne by right. Such adopted supporters are specifically for use within the Order and not hereditary (unless also granted by another competent heraldic authority), and are to be entered in the Armorial Records of the Order. The Grand Officer of Arms bears by tradition as supporters two heralds of the United Orders of Mount Carmel and Saint Lazarus of the 17th century, habited proper, and bearing in the exterior hand a scroll argent and the interior hand, a baton of the Order proper, and standing upon a compartment of a stone plinth also proper.

The Spiritual Protector, Grand Master, Grand Master Emeritus and the Coadjutor and Hereditary Commanders may quarter the Arms of the Order.

Insignia for the Order of Saint Lazarus are senior to those of the Companionship of Merit of Saint Lazarus and take heraldic precedence. Ranks of the Order of Merit of Saint Lazarus are similar to those of the Order of Saint Lazarus and the Companionship of Merit decoration should generally be suspended below the shield.

Clergy: Clergy are subject to similar rules as equivalent ranking lay members. Their badges vary in that the SLJ Monogram and Wreath replace the Knight's Trophy where appropriate. The display of ecclesiastical head dress and other insignia is subject to the customs and regulations of their respective Churches.

Ladies: The custom of differencing the arms of women by displaying them on a lozenge or cartouche or in some cases omitting elements of helmet and crest is inconsistent with modern practice and unless

specifically requested by the lady concerned, there is no distinction between the arms of men and women. As with the clergy, the military trophy is replaced by the SLJ monogram within a wreath.

Other Decorations, etc. Awarded by the Order:

These may also be displayed below the arms, flanking the principal insignia, or otherwise as appropriate, and following the same general conventions as the above ranks of the Order of Saint Lazarus. One collar may be illustrated, and a maximum of the three senior orders (showing only the senior medal of each Order) will be shown as pendant medals.

Insignia of Office:

Certain High Officers of the Order may display additaments to their Armorial Bearings, behind the shield, as follows:

The Grand Officer of Arms	One upright baton
Hereditary Commanders	A sword and a baton in saltire
Quartermaster General	A quill pen and a sword in saltire
The Grand Marshal	Two batons in saltire
The Grand Justiciar	A quill pen and a baton in saltire
The Grand Hospitaller	Two staves of Aesculapius in saltire
The Grand Archivist	Two quill pens in saltire
Keeper of the Privy Seal	A key and a baton in saltire
The Grand Custodian(s)	Two keys in saltire
The Grand Referendary	A mace and baton in saltire
The Grand Chancellor	Two maces in saltire
Ecclesiastical Grand Prior	A processional cross and a sceptre with cross in saltire
The Grand Commander	A sword and sceptre with the Order's crown in saltire
The Coadjutor	A baton and a sceptre ensigned with the Order's crown in saltire
The Grand Master	Two sceptres in saltire, each ensigned with the Order's Crown

The first-named additament will appear in dexter chief to sinister base, surmounting the second additament which will appear in sinister chief and dexter base. Where aesthetics make it more appropriate, a single upright additament may be displayed bendwise or palewise. For Vice- or Deputy ranks, a single first-named additament will be used.

Insignia, Awards, Decorations, Other Than Those of St. Lazarus

These are not subject to regulation by the Order, but should not be included with those of St. Lazarus in armorial displays unless awarded by reputable authorities.

The Heraldic Officers of the Order reserve the right to decline to include any particular Insignia, without prejudice to the status claimed on behalf of the Order or other body concerned.

Armorial Bearings and Flags of the Order

The Arms of the Order:

Argent, a cross vert, surmounting a cross of eight points vert, encircled by the Grand Collar, the whole displayed on a mantle sable, lined ermine, tasselled corded and fringed or, bearing on the sinister side a cross of eight points vert fimbriated or, all ensigned with the Eastern crown of the Order or, lined vert, on which is an orb and a cross of eight points or.

The motto of the Order "ATAVIS ET ARMIS" is displayed on a scroll below the arms.

The Arms of the Grand Master:

Quarterly: 1 and 4, the arms of the Order; 2 and 3, the personal arms of the Grand Master.

The Cross Badge of the Order:

A cross of eight points, commonly called a Maltese Cross, vert.

The Banner of the Order:

Argent, a cross vert, drop:fly ratio 1:2.

Flag of the Order's Volunteer Corps:

Argent, a Maltese cross of eight points vert, drop:fly ratio 1:2.

The Ensign/Banner of the Grand Master :

The full achievement of arms of the Grand Master upon an argent ground, fringed gold, square.

Pennons of the Order:

Triangular, bearing respectively the arms of the Order or the eight-point cross Badge of the Order, drop:fly ratio >1:3.5.

The Standard of the Order:

In the hoist: argent, a cross vert: in the fly: argent, semé of crosses of eight points vert, and upon two transversed bands also vert, in letters or, the Motto: “ATAVIS ET ARMIS”, the whole fringed vert (fringe optional), drop:fly ratio 1:6.

The Pipe or Trumpet Banner of the Order:

Argent, with the arms of the Order throughout, square.

The Banner of Jurisdictions and Sub-jurisdictions:

The arms of the Jurisdiction, drop:fly ratio 4:5. The Jurisdiction banners for primarily indoor use may be fringed and tasselled (2 tassels) or, those of the sub-jurisdictions similarly fringed and tasselled but argent.

The Gonfalon of the Order, Jurisdictions and Sub-Jurisdictions:

These are processional flags and hung from a horizontal spar on a pike. They are the same dimensions and design as the Banner of Jurisdictions but with the longer axis vertical, as appropriate for a flag carried upright. The pendants (normally five) are alternate green and white.

The Arms of the Order Differenced for the Jurisdictions:

Each independent Jurisdiction (reporting directly to the Grand Master, and not to another jurisdiction) may adopt a version of the arms of the Order differenced with an appropriate device in the dexter chief canton. Such devices should follow the heraldic rules by being on a metal (argent/or) ground. Where devices are on a coloured background, they may more appropriately appear as a canton (with a strip of argent between them and the cross vert). Jurisdiction arms have traditionally been displayed in the first quarter since the first registration of order arms differenced by jurisdiction at Lyon Court in Scotland on 6 September 1967. This position allows for the largest display field on the shield and a white background to maximize clarity and reproducibility. For France, as the historical seat of the Order (or areas formerly or currently under

French rule in part or in whole), the jurisdiction and sub-jurisdiction arms may be displayed on an escutcheon on the centre of the cross. For sub-jurisdictions, such as commanderies which report to another higher (for example national) jurisdiction, or for other non-independent jurisdictions, a heraldic charge may appear in the second (sinister chief) canton of the national or higher jurisdictional arms. It should appear on a shield on the eight-pointed (“Maltese”) cross of Saint Lazarus, but never on the full achievement of arms, which is reserved for the arms of the Order or full national or equivalent higher jurisdictions. Generally, jurisdictional arms displayed should be in the form of a full achievement of arms (displayed on a mantle with crown, motto, cross and collar), or for smaller presentations where detail may not reproduce well, small arms, with just shield and motto displayed on the eight-pointed cross of Saint Lazarus, vert.

All such devices are to be approved by the Grand Officer of Arms and entered in the Armorial Records of the Order. Any heraldic representations of arms of the order on medals or decorations, seals or flags are to be approved by the Grand Officer of Arms.

For general purposes the Jurisdictions should use the arms of the Order undifferenced, but the differenced arms may be used for websites, letterhead, borne on a banner or otherwise as appropriate for jurisdictional purposes, and at Jurisdiction functions or combined functions of the Order.

The origins and evolution of the Arms, Cross Badge and Insignia of the Order are set out in "Ordo Sancti Lazari MCMLXXXIII“.

Wherever possible, arms should be reproduced in full colour. Where this is not possible, black and white with grey tone is preferred.

The Category of Justice

Heraldic and genealogic evidence of at least four generations of nobility descending from at least one great-grandparent, or all four grandparents armigerous by granting of noble arms or by letters patent, is required for admission to the Category of Justice. Admission to the Category of Justice for members with arms granted by countries with a sovereign state college of heraldry with authority to grant a coat of arms and file letters patent may also occur. Where such arms as are specified above are

granted, the member and their descendants are eligible to apply to the Grand Chancellor for the Category of Justice of the Order. Documentation in support of admission to the Category of Justice will be assessed by the Grand Officer of Arms and, where the conditions specified in the Regulation are met, confirmed by the Grand Chancellor in admitting to the Category of Justice. No lesser conditions of award than those specified in these Regulations are permitted. Spouses of members admitted to the Category of Justice are not eligible in right of their spouse, but must qualify separately in their own right. Jurisdictions do not award the Category of Justice.

The Grand Master may at his discretion grant personal nobility and arms to those highly distinguished in their professions. Those who hold military general officer rank or its equivalent, ministers or heads of government departments or government statutory authorities, governors, or mayors of major cities, members of the Judiciary, heads of major national or international bodies or associations, distinguished professionals who have held the rank of full professor or its professional equivalent for over a decade, heads of major institutions of commerce, and Knights or Dames Grand Cross of recognized military or state orders and those with nobility and arms of less than four generations, may be eligible.

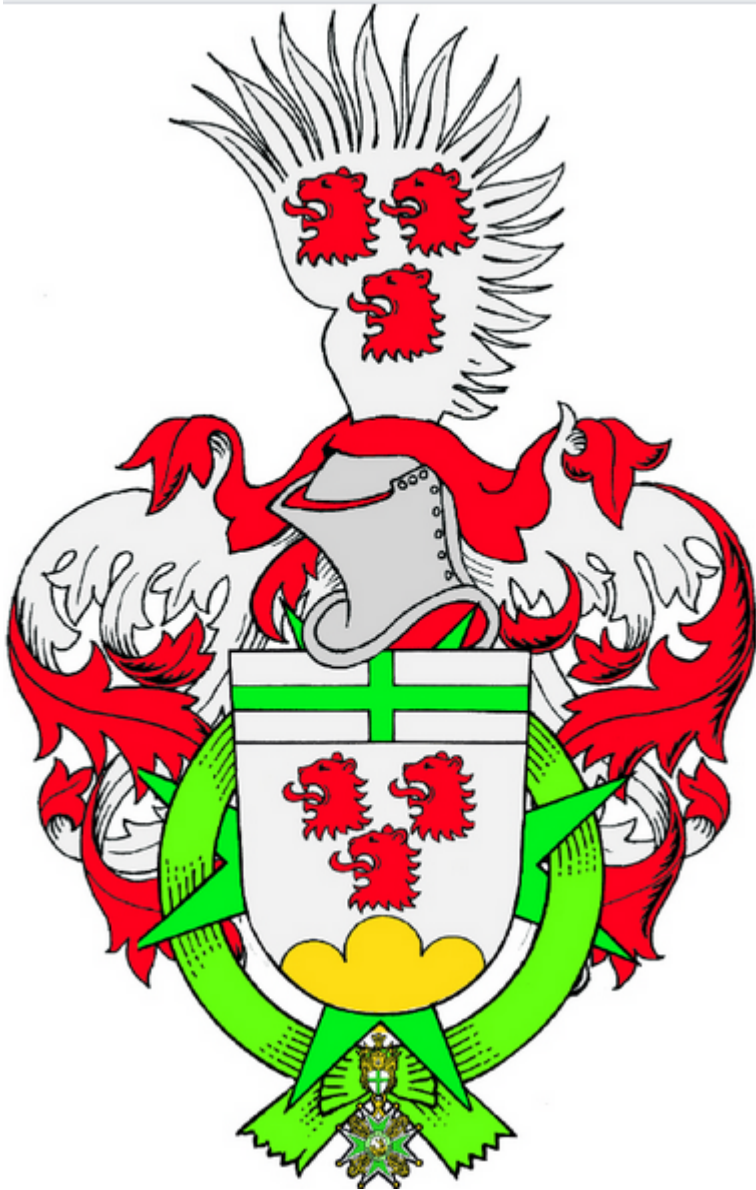
A note on the artwork:

Two eminent heraldic artists, both founding members of the Order were also members of the Heraldic Society of Finland. Chev. Olof Ericsson and Chev. Tapio Vallioja belonged to the famous group of artists who designed major part of the arms for Finnish municipals and even for many Lazarus members between 1974 and 2000. Ericsson died in the 1980s and Vallioja 2005. Images of the arms are extant but without color. During the last two years Heinz Sturmer has been colouring them in by computer. Eriksson's and Vallioja's drawings have high quality and a clear and distinct style - we don't have any reason to change the style. Heinz has even redrawn many current arms designed by Reijo Helläkoski, Harri Rantanen and Tuomas Hyrsky. Helläkoski is in my opinion the best heraldic artist in Finland to day. Helläkoski paints the arms like a piece of art and Heinz redraws them in a suitable format for printing.

Introduction to current French Heraldic practice.

Napoleonic heraldry is not substantially different from traditional heraldry, with the notable exception of the charges used to indicate official functions and positions, and for the bonnets which replaced coronets and helms. In other respects, the traditional partitions, tinctures, rules, and charges were used. A strong sense of hierarchy permeates it: Or is ranked above argent, azure above gules, etc. But, as many grantees were new men, and the arms often alluded to their life or specific actions, many new or unusual charges were introduced. Families which previously had arms were usually granted the same.

Napoleon did not try to introduce marks of cadency. The decree of March 3, 1810 (art. 11) states: "The name, arms and livery shall pass from the father to all sons" although the distinctive marks of title could only pass to the son who inherited it. Again, this applied only to the bearers of Napoleonic titles.

The rigid system of Napoleonic heraldry did not outlast the Empire, and was thus applied only 6 years. The 2nd Empire (1852-1870) made no effort to revive it, although the official arms of France were again those of Napoleon I.

At the 1983 VIIth Congress of Genealogy and Heraldry in Versailles it was decided to create the French Heraldic Council in order to advise and oversee all matters heraldic, including the Granting of new Arms.

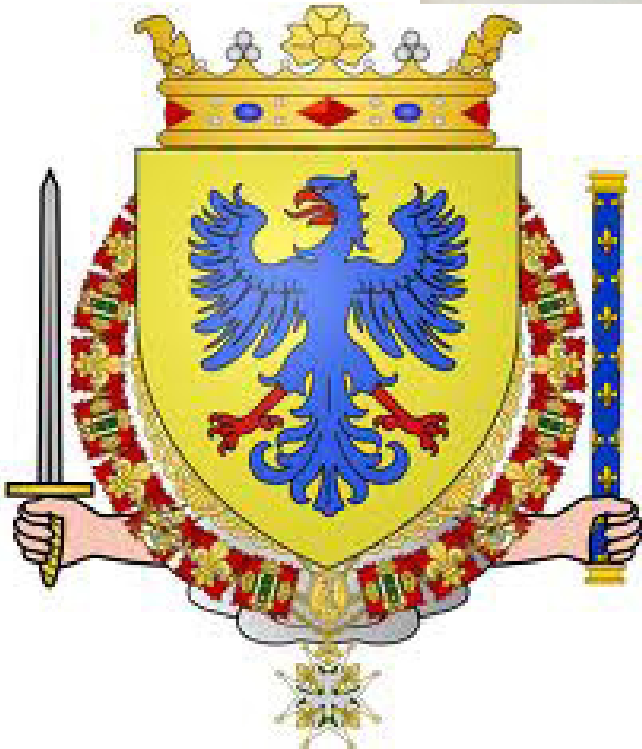

Heraldry in the Maltese Islands

The Maltese Islands had, during the Medieval Period, been influenced by the heraldic and nobiliary developments in the Kingdoms of the Two Sicilies with a number of noble armigerous families being established on the islands.

The first list of noble families was compiled by the historian Gio Francesco Abela in 1647 and lists a total of 123 armigerous families bearing nobiliary status. A description of the coats-of-arms of some of these families is included within the text. A list of extant or extinct surnames prevalent on the sister island of Gozo was prepared by Pietro Francesco Agius de Soldanis in the mid-18th century. This too described some of the associated coat-of-arms of specific families.

During the short short interlude of French rule under Napoleon at the end of the 18th century the Maltese aristocracy was abolished and they were ordered to burn their nobiliary grants in public. Very few are extant as a result but some families managed to hide their Letters Patent and burn substituted documents instead. Under British rule, the Nobility of Malta was recognized after a Royal Commission established the legitimacy of each individual claim. The Stemmi Maltesi, containing the arms of almost 800 Maltese families, was published in the 19th century. The original drawings were produced in black and white. This was republished in colour in 1989. After the 1964 Independence, the Maltese government decided not to abolish the nobility but to cease to recognize its de facto existence. This attitude persisted after Malta was declared a Republic in 1974.

As a result the legal situation today regarding the registration of family coats-of-arms is still very ambiguous and anomalous. In the first instance there was no College of Arms or Heraldry Office in Malta and the use of Armorial Bearings was not formally regulated. So basically, in Malta, everyone was allowed to use a coat-of-arms suitable to his/her surname provided this did not encroach on the rights of others. The family names prevalent in Malta can be broadly grouped into:

- 1, Maltese family names belonging to the nobility,
- 2, Maltese family names belonging to families allied to nobility by marriage,
- 3, Maltese family names belonging to families not connected with the nobility, and
- 4, Foreign imported family names.

Many of the Arms shown are of Members who have either resigned or are presumed deceased. Deceased Members are shown in a black border.

Unless otherwise stated all artwork is by Charles Sevona-Ventura. Essentially all of the remaining shields have been taken from the Stemmi Maltesi (q.v.) or Wikipedia.

In keeping with Maltese custom hyphernated surnames are listed alphabetically with the first surname first..

Note:

The Government of Malta has now appointed a Chief Herald of Malta but until matters are fully clarified the Arms of Members are shown as they were in use up until the **25th of June 2019**.
